## SHOW DAY BY-LAWS

## Saturday Gate Entry Fees: <br> Pre paid Family Membership $\$ 25.00$ (see Membership Form on back of Entry Form) <br> At the Gate Prices: <br> Family Ticket \$30.00-2 Adults \& 2 Children 17 and under of the family. <br> Adults (18+ years) $\$ 15.00$, <br> Pensioners(not health care card) \& Students 5-17yo \$5.00, 4yo \& under free.

- Positive identification of all animals must be produced on demand.
- Protests must be lodged with the Secretary no later than 6pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of $\$ 20$. Protests will be considered by a Committee appointed for the purpose and if reasonable grounds are shown, the deposit will be refunded.
- All prize money not collected by 5pm on show day shall become the property of the Camperdown P \& A Society Inc.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or reject any entry without giving a reason for doing so. The Committee's decision on all points shall be final without recourse.
- All entries must be made subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society and they are only accepted on this distinct understanding.
- All persons causing annoyance by loud comments on the decision of the judge, or other unseemly or insulting behaviour will, after having been cautioned by a member of the Committee, Steward or the Secretary is expelled from the Show, and if an exhibitor, may have their exhibits disqualified.
- The Committee may withhold any prize(s) where an exhibitor in making an entry has made statements proved to their satisfaction to be erroneous or fraudulent. Such exhibitor and their stock will be disqualified and excluded from exhibiting, riding, or competing at the Societies Show during the pleasure of the Committee. A disqualified exhibitor if also a member shall be liable for expulsion from the Society.
- Any disqualification shall be endorsed by all affiliated Societies in the South West Vas Group.
- No ribbon or card won at previous shows should be attached to or displayed on or near an exhibit.
- All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions and or attend their exhibits at their own risk and the Society will not be responsible for any accident that may result to any exhibitor and or competitor as a result of such competition or be caused through or by any exhibits.
- In case any exhibit, whilst on the Societies grounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits or property of any member of the Society or general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, and it's officers against all damages, costs, claims,
members property and effects from expenses and liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
- In the event of any accident occurring on the Society's grounds to any exhibitor, competitor, member of the Committee or member of the general public during any show exhibition or other function organized and conducted by the Society, any member of the Committee, or other Official of the Society shall if he considers it expedient to do so, be entitled to engage the services of a doctor or other person or persons to render medical attention to the person or persons involved in such accident, but neither the Society nor the Committee, nor any Official thereof, shall by so doing be deemed to incur any liability for any expense resulting from medical attention so procured and shall indemnify the Society, it's Officers and its Members from and against all damages, costs, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection therewith.
- The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for the loss or damage of livestock or any other exhibit at the Society's exhibitions.
- The definition of a Novice shall be any exhibitor who has never won a first prize at an Agricultural Show up to the closing time of entries.
- The use of Tranquillisers, Stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of animals is forbidden.
- Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under veterinary supervision.
- PHOTOGRAPHS: The Camperdown P \& A Society will be taking photographs which may be used on the Club Website, Facebook, and other advertising, etc: your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.
- SMOKING: We ask that everyone abides but the current smoking laws \& take notice of signs located around the grounds.
- ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT: Exhibitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" for installation at each power outlet they use. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection. All exhibitors' electrical items, including leads, must have current safety compliance tags.
- RESPECT Bullying is an issue in many sports today. VAS Ltd wants members, organisers and officials to know that bullying is not acceptable at any VAS Ltd events. Every official, competitor \& helper has the right to be treated with dignity and respect. VAS Ltd has a responsibility to ensure this occurs at our events. VAS Ltd can only discipline the appropriate person/s if intimidation is reported. We encourage any person who feels they have been bullied to report it in writing to VAS Ltd: • Reports will be handled promptly and confidentially;

## VAS RULES \& REGULATIONS - for all Cooking, Craft \& Photography Competitions

- Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in State Final
- An exhibitor may only represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level.
- An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to complete in the competition.
- If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at a Group or State Final level, then the second placegetter is eligible to compete
- A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
- All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to the entry at a local show/field day(except cooking classes)
- An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a Show Season (spring to autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same show season, the exhibitor must forfeit/refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
- Late entries not accepted

For all VAS Cooking Competitions - plus rules and regulations above

- The fruit cake competitions follow the show-group-state level of competition.

## The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

## 250 g sultanas

250 g chopped raisins
250 g currants
125 g chopped mixed peel
90 g chopped red glace cherries
90 g chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250 g plain flour
60 g self raising flour
$1 / 2$ teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind

## METHOD:

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
3. Place mixture into a prepared $\underline{\mathbf{2 0} \mathbf{c m}\left(8^{\prime \prime}\right) \text { square, straight sided, square cornered tin }}$ and bake in a slow oven for approximately $31 / 2-4$ hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

- 375 g plain flour
- 2 teaspoon baking powder
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon allspice
- 2 teaspoon salt
- 345 g castor sugar
- 375 ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated ( 350 g )
- 220 g tin crushed pineapple, drained
$\cdot 180 \mathrm{~g}$ pecan nuts crushed


## METHOD:

1. Preheat oven to $180^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(160^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right.$ fan), Grease a $20 \mathrm{~cm}\left(8^{\prime \prime}\right)$ round cake tin lightly, and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans.
3. Bake for approximately $90-100$ minutes.

Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

## The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

375 g mixed fruit
3/4cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon mixed spice
$1 / 2$ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
½ cup water
1 cup self raising flour

1 cup plain flour
2 tablespoon marmalade
125 g butter
2 eggs, lightly beaten
1/4 teaspoon salt
$1 / 2$ cup sherry

## METHOD:

1. Place mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil
2. Simmer gently for three (3) minutes, then remove form stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool.
3. Add sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well
4. Fold in sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

$21 / 2$ cups self raising flour 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon $1 / 4$ teaspoon ground nutmeg 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed) 1/3 cup chopped pitted dates 1 cup coarsely grated carrot

## METHOD:

1. Pre heat oven to $190^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ (moderately hot)
2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with, Round Paper Muffin Cases classic white muffin cases size ( 35 mm Height $\times 90 \mathrm{~mm}$ Wide $\times 50 \mathrm{~mm}$ Base)
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
4. Spoon Mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer; if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.
