

# SHOW DAY BY-LAWS

- Positive identification of all animals must be produced when required.
- Protests must be lodged with the Secretary no later than 4pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of \$50. Protests will be considered by a Committee appointed for the purpose and if reasonable grounds are shown, the deposit will be refunded.
- All prize money not collected by 5pm on show day shall become the property of the Camperdown P & A Society Inc.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or reject any entry without giving a reason for doing so. The Committee's decision on all points shall be final without recourse.
- All entries must be made subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society and they are only accepted on this distinct understanding.
- All persons causing annoyance by loud comments on the decision of the judge, or other unseemly or insulting behaviour will, after having been cautioned by a member of the Committee, Steward or the Secretary is expelled from the Show, and if an exhibitor, may have their exhibits disqualified.
- The Committee may withhold any prize(s) where an exhibitor in making an entry has made statements proved to their satisfaction to be erroneous or fraudulent. Such exhibitor and their stock will be disqualified and excluded from exhibiting, riding, or competing at the Societies Show during the pleasure of the Committee. A disqualified exhibitor if also a member shall be liable for expulsion from the Society.
- Any disqualification shall be endorsed by all affiliated Societies in the South West Vas Group.
- No ribbon or card won at previous shows should be attached to or displayed on or near an exhibit.
- All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions and or attend
  their exhibits at their own risk and the Society will not be responsible for any
  accident that may result to any exhibitor and or competitor as a result of
  such competition or be caused through or by any exhibits.
- In case any exhibit, whilst on the Societies grounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits or property of any member of the Society or general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, and it's officers against all damages, costs, claims, members property and effects from expenses and liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
- In the event of any accident occurring on the Society's grounds to any exhibitor, competitor, member of the Committee or member of the general public during any show exhibition or other function organized and conducted

by the Society, any member of the Committee, or other Official of the Society shall if he considers it expedient to do so, be entitled to engage the services of a doctor or other person or persons to render medical attention to the person or persons involved in such accident, but neither the Society nor the Committee, nor any Official thereof, shall by so doing be deemed to incur any liability for any expense resulting from medical attention so procured and shall indemnify the Society, it's Officers and its Members from and against all damages, costs, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection therewith.

- The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for the loss or damage of livestock or any other exhibit at the Society's exhibitions.
- The definition of a Novice shall be any exhibitor who has never won a first prize at an Agricultural Show up to the closing time of entries.
- The use of Tranquillisers, Stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of animals is forbidden.
- Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing all animals is at the owner's risk.
   Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under veterinary supervision.
- PHOTOGRAPHS: The Camperdown P & A Society will be taking photographs which may be used by the P & A Society Website, Facebook, and other advertising, etc: your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.
- **SMOKING**: We ask that everyone abides by the current smoking laws & take notice of signs located around the grounds.
- **ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT**: Exhibitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" for installation at each power outlet they use. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection. All exhibitors' electrical items, including leads, must have current safety compliance tags.
- RESPECT Bullying is an issue in many sports today. VAS Ltd wants members, organisers and officials to know that bullying is not acceptable at any VAS Ltd events. Every official, competitor & helper has the right to be treated with dignity and respect. VAS Ltd has a responsibility to ensure this occurs at our events. VAS Ltd can only discipline the appropriate person/s if intimidation is reported. We encourage any person who feels they have been bullied to report it in writing to VAS Ltd: Reports will be handled promptly and confidentially;

VAS entries will be judged at 12noon on Friday 13th October. Entry to the Arts Shed is not permitted while judging is in process.

VAS RULES & REGULATIONS – for all Cooking, Craft & Photography Competitions

- Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- **Professionals are not eligible**, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that Craft, Art Form or Technique.
- All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to the entry at a local show/field day(except cooking classes)
- All VAS competitions follow the three levels of competition: Show, Group & State Level.
- An exhibit having won at a Local Show will compete at the following Group Final. The
  winning exhibit at the Group Final will then compete in the State Final at the same year
  Royal Melbourne Show.
- An exhibitor having won at Show Level is not eligible to enter the same section at any other Show until the Group Final Judging.
- An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
- If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at a Group or State Final level, then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
- An exhibit having won a State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor must forfeit/refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
- Late entries not accepted

For all VAS Cooking Competitions - plus rules and regulations above

- All entrants must follow the recipe and specifications provided in recipe section.
- An exhibitor having won at their Local Show will bake another cake for the Group Final;
   and then the winner of the Group Final will bake another cake for the State Final.

For all VAS Sewing Competitions - plus rules and regulations above

 An exhibit having won at a Show Level will compete at the Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.

#### V1 VAS Rich Fruit Cake Competition

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

 All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section

#### The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

125g chopped mixed peel 250g butter

90g chopped red glace cherries 250g soft brown sugar

90g chopped blanched almonds 4 large eggs

1/3 cup sherry or brandy
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
250g plain flour
1/2 teaspoon almond essence

60g self raising flour

½ teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind

#### **METHOD:**

1. Cut the fruit and almonds into 3-4 pieces. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight.

- 2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- 3. Place mixture into a prepared **20cm square**, **straight sided**, **square cornered tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

# V2 VAS Carrot Cake Competition

Open to carrot cake enthusiasts everywhere.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

 All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section

## The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

- · 375g plain flour
- 2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon allspice
- · 2 teaspoon salt

- 345g castor sugar
- 375ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350g)
- 220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- •180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed

#### **METHOD:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan), Grease a 23cm (9") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

#### V3- VAS Knitting Competition

- A Hand Knitted Blanket, not more the 1 metre on any one side.
- Each exhibit must be made from pure wool/ wool blend of any ply.
- Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from woollen mill.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

#### V4- VAS Crochet Competition – A 3D ITEM

- A 3D Item, no larger than 50cm on any one side, made from pure wool/ wool blend of any ply.
- Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from woollen mill.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

#### V5- VAS Sewing Competition – WEARABLE VEST

- The item is to be a Wearable Vest, Fully Lined with Embellishments allowed.
- Sewn by machine.
- May be hand finished.
- Knitted/Crocheted items not acceptable
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

# V6- VAS Embroidery Competition

- The exhibit to be an article of hand embroidery any type, excluding cross stitch
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section

#### V7- VAS Cross Stitch Competition

- The exhibit to be an article of cross stitch any type up to 60cms on all sides including frame.
   Minimal Embellishments allowed.

## V8- VAS Patchwork Competition

- The exhibit is to be not more than one metre on any one side
- Machine/ hand pieced and quilted by exhibitor only.

#### V10 - VAS Junior Boiled Fruit Cake

- A competition for junior cake bakers aged under 18 on the day of their local show day.
- · This section is open only to exhibitors 17 years and under

# The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

375g mixed fruit ½ cup sherry

% cup brown sugar2 eggs, lightly beaten1 teaspoon mixed spice2 tablespoons marmalade½ cup water1 cup self raising flour125g butter1 cup plain flour½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda¼ teaspoon salt

#### **METHOD:**

- 1. Place mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water & butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil
- 2. Simmer gently for three (3) minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool.
- 3. Add sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well
- 4. Fold in sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
- 5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

#### V11 - VAS Junior Carrot and Date Muffins

- A competition for junior cake bakers under 18 on the day of their local show day.
- Show Entries: Four (4) muffins per paper plate

## The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

2½ cups self raising flour 1 tablespoon orange marmalade

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 cup canola oil
1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
1/3 cup chopped pitted dates
1 cup reduced fat milk

1 cup coarsely grated carrot

#### **METHOD:**

- 1. Pre heat oven to 190°C (moderately hot)
- 2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with Round Paper Muffin Cases classic white muffin cases size (35mm Height x 90mm Wide x 50mm Base)
- 3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates and carrots.

Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk, Mix until just combined.

- 4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
- 5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer; if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
- 6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.
