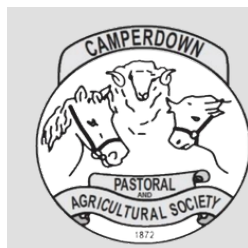

SHOW DAY BY-LAWS

Positive identification of all animals must be produced when required.

- Protests must be lodged with the Secretary no later than 4pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of \$50. Protests will be considered by a Committee appointed for the purpose and if reasonable grounds are shown, the deposit will be refunded.
 - All prize money not collected by 5pm on show day, shall become the property of the Camperdown P & A Society Inc.
 - The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or reject any entry without giving a reason for doing so. The Committee's decision on all points shall be final without recourse.
 - All entries must be made subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society and they are only accepted on this distinct understanding.
 - All persons causing annoyance by loud comments on the decision of the judge, or other unseemly or insulting behaviour will, after having been cautioned by a member of the Committee, Steward or the Secretary is expelled from the Show, and if an exhibitor, may have their exhibits disqualified.
 - The Committee may withhold any prize(s) where an exhibitor in making an entry has made statements proved to their satisfaction to be erroneous or fraudulent. Such exhibitor and their stock will be disqualified and excluded from exhibiting, riding, or competing at the Societies Show. A disqualified exhibitor if also a member, shall be liable for expulsion from the Society.
 - Any disqualification shall be endorsed by all affiliated Societies in the South West Vas Group.
 - No ribbon or card won at previous shows should be attached to or displayed on or near an exhibit.
 - All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions and attend their exhibits at their own risk. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may result to an exhibit or competitor as a result of the competition.
 - Owners and exhibitors must have their own Public Liability Insurance. If any exhibit whilst on the Societies grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibitors, property or the general public. The owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society against all damages, costs and claims.
- In the event of any accident occurring at the grounds, licensed first aid are engaged for both days of the show.
- Duty of Care is required of all competitors to avoid exposing themselves, other people and property to injury or damage.

· The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for the loss or damage of livestock or any other exhibit at the Society's showgrounds. It is the owners' responsibility to provide security to keep their animals safe for the duration of the event.

· Hazard and Incident Reporting. Exhibitors and Competitors must report any hazards and incidents to Secretary's Office immediately.

All areas must be kept clean and tidy with access and exit routes available at all times. Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards.

· Media comments regarding the Camperdown P & A Society Inc. should be referred to the President, Secretary or Show Secretary.

· The use of Tranquilizers, Stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of animals is forbidden.

· Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under veterinary supervision.

· PHOTOGRAPHS: The Camperdown P & A Society will be taking photographs which may be used by the P & A Society Website, Facebook, and other advertising, etc. Your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.

· SMOKING: We ask that everyone abides by the current smoking laws & take notice of signs located around the grounds.

· ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT: Exhibitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" for installation at each power outlet they use. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection. All exhibitors' electrical items, including leads, must have current safety compliance tags. Tagging on the day will cost \$50 per tag.

· Use of radiant electrical /gas heaters and double adaptors are prohibited.

· RESPECT Bullying is an issue in many sports today. VAS Ltd wants members, organizers and officials to know that bullying is not acceptable at any VAS Ltd events. Every official, competitor & helper has the right to be treated with dignity and respect. VAS Ltd has a responsibility to ensure this occurs at our events. VAS Ltd can only discipline the appropriate person/s if intimidation is reported. We encourage any person who feels they have been bullied to report it in writing to VAS Ltd: · Reports will be handled promptly and confidentially;

· Disciplinary action will be taken against those who have bullied others at events run under the auspices of VAS Ltd.

The young farmers competition is a fast paced set of fun challenges inspired by life on the farm.

The competition is open to mixed teams of four, aged 18–35 and must have at least one representative from each gender.

3. VAS COMPETITIONS

There will be judging and prizes for the Victorian Agricultural Shows (VAS) competitions, but no entry fees.

VAS entries will be judged at 12noon on Friday 11th October.

Entry to the Arts Shed is not permitted while judging is in process.

VAS RULES & REGULATIONS – for all Cooking, Craft & Photography Competitions

- Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- **Professionals are not eligible**, which is defined as someone who works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that Craft, Art Form or Technique.
- All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to the entry at a local show/field day(except cooking classes).
- All VAS competitions follow the three levels of competition: Show, Group & State Level.
- An exhibit having won at a Local Show will compete at the following Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final will then compete in the State Final at the same year Royal Melbourne Show.
- An exhibitor having won at Show Level is not eligible to enter the same section at any other Show until the Group Final Judging.
- An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
- If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at a Group or State Final level, then the second place getter is eligible to compete.
- An exhibit having won a State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor must forfeit/refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
- Late entries not accepted.

For all VAS Cooking Competitions – plus rules and regulations on the previous page.

- All entrants must follow the recipe and specifications provided in the recipe section.
- An exhibitor having won at their Local Show will bake another cake for the Group Final; and then the winner of the Group Final will bake another cake for the State Final.

For all VAS Sewing Competitions – plus rules and regulations on the previous page.

- An exhibit having won at a Show Level will compete at the Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.

V1 VAS Rich Fruit Cake Competition

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants:

250g sultanas	¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
250g chopped raisins	½ teaspoon ground ginger
250g currants	½ teaspoon ground cloves
125g chopped mixed peel	250g butter
90g chopped red glace cherries	250g soft brown sugar
90g chopped blanched almonds	4 large eggs
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	½ teaspoon vanilla essence
250g plain flour	½ teaspoon almond essence
60g self raising flour	½ teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind

METHOD:

1. Cut the fruit and almonds into 3-4 pieces. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures.
Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
3. Place mixture into a prepared 20cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

V2 VAS Carrot Cake Competition

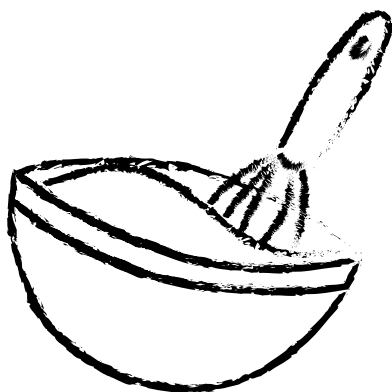
Open to carrot cake enthusiasts everywhere.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants:

375g plain flour
2 teaspoon baking powder
1½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
½ teaspoon allspice
A pinch of salt
345g castor sugar
350ml vegetable oil
4 eggs
3 medium carrots, grated (350g)
220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed



METHOD:

1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan), Grease a 23cm (9") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin. TIP: Do not over mix.
3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

V3- VAS Knitting Competition

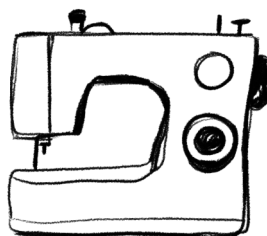
- A Hand Knitted Item, not more than 150cms on any one side.
- Knitted in one piece incorporating at least 5 different patterns.
- Each exhibit must be made from pure wool/wool blend of any ply.
- Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from woollen mill.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

V4- VAS Crochet Competition – CROCHETED ANIMAL NO LARGER THAN 30CM X 30CM X 30CM MADE FROM PURE WOOL/ WOOL BLEND OR COTTON OF ANY PLY.

- Embroidered or crocheted embellishments are allowed.
- No buttons or loose items as crocheted item must be safe for children.
- Exhibitor to attach label from wool/cotton used.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

V5- VAS Sewing Competition – EVERYDAY WEARABLE DRESS FOR AN ADULT OR CHILD

- Dress should be part or fully lined. Lining can include facing. Machine sewn and can be hand finished, embellishments allowed.
- Knitted/Crocheted Items not acceptable.
- Dress to be judged on 50% presentation and 50% workmanship.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.



V6- VAS Embroidery Competition

- The exhibit to be an article of hand embroidery any type, excluding cross stitch.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

V7- VAS Cross Stitch Competition

- The exhibit to be an article of cross stitch any type up to 60cms on all sides including frame. Minimal embellishments allowed.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

V8- VAS Patchwork Competition

- The exhibit is to be no larger than 90cm x 125cm.
- Machine/ hand pieced and quilted by exhibitor only.
- Minimal embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

V9- VAS Photography Competition ~

Theme "ARCHITECTURE"

(Bridge, building or structure in Australia)

- Unframed, print no larger than 8" X 12" or 20cm by 30cm.
- Must be mounted on thick card (mount no larger than 3cms).
- All rules and regulations on this page to be taken in conjunction with the general VAS Rules & Regulations listed at start of Homecrafts Section.

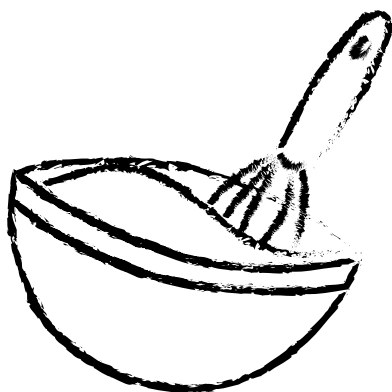

V10 – VAS Junior Boiled Fruit Cake

- A competition for junior cake bakers aged under 18 on the day of their local Show.
- This section is open only to exhibitors 17 years and under.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

375g mixed fruit
¾ cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon mixed spice
½ cup water
125g butter
½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
½ cup sherry
2 eggs, lightly beaten
2 tablespoons marmalade
1 cup self raising flour
1 cup plain flour
¼ teaspoon salt



METHOD:

1. Place mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water & butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for three (3) minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool.
3. Add sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well
4. Fold in sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

V11 – VAS Junior Carrot and Sultana Muffins

- A competition for junior cake bakers under 18 on the day of their local show day.
- Show Entries: Four (4) muffins per paper plate.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

2½ cups self raising flour	1 cup canola oil
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon	2 eggs, lightly beaten
¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg	¾ cup orange juice
1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)	1 cup reduced fat milk
1/3 cup sultanas, each one chopped in half	
1 cup coarsely grated carrot	
1 tablespoon orange marmalade	

METHOD:

1. Pre heat oven to 190 DEGREES CELCIUS (moderately hot).
2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with Round Paper Muffin Cases – classic white muffin case size can vary between (30mm – 40mm Height x 70mm – 80mm Wide x 45mm – 55mm Base).
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in sultanas and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer; if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

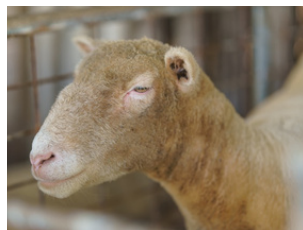

NATIONAL SHEEP HEALTH STATEMENT

Explanatory Notes

- NOTE 1: Biosecurity Plan:** Agreed actions and activities of farms and/or producers to prevent the incursion of animal disease(s) into a flock or onto a property. It may outline measures including (but not limited to) conditions on sheep movements into the area, vaccine policy and response to disease detection. These plans can be at a property or regional level and can cover a range of diseases. The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual for Grazing Livestock Production and regional biosecurity plan guidelines can be used to develop plans.
- NOTE 2: Footrot:** Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on interstate movements of sheep, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.
- NOTE 3: SheepMAP:** An audited quality assurance program incorporating a property biosecurity plan, animal health risk assessment, testing, and movement controls that provide a source of low risk animals. (Note: level of testing varies depending on status.)
- NOTE 4: Faecal 350:** A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or equivalent test in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.
Abattoir 500: At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.
Abattoir 150: At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.
- NOTE 5: Other:** Post mortem examination by a SheepMAP vet with no indication of OJD, or other negative test.
- NOTE 6: Infected Flocks:** A flock which is infected with OJD, and there is evidence of or likely potential for transmission of infection within the flock, and the flock has not met the requirements for resolution of infection in accordance with the current National OJD Standard Definitions, Rules and Guidelines (SDR&Gs).
Suspected of being infected: A flock is suspected of being infected with OJD if the owner has reasonable grounds to believe that the flock has been exposed to OJD infection or that OJD may exist in the flock, based on:
– trace back or trace forward contact with an infected flock
– contact with OJD contaminated land or facilities
– a positive John's disease screening test, e.g. abattoir monitoring or blood (ELISA) test
– is a neighbour of an infected flock unless there is an effective biosecurity barrier
– clinical signs of OJD, or
– advice from the relevant state agricultural department.
AND the flock has not met the requirements for resolution of suspicion in accordance with the SDR&Gs.
- NOTE 7: NLIS 'T' tag (terminal) lamb:** A lamb which is to be slaughtered before it cuts its first permanent teeth and is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'T' tag. The 'T' tag may be a requirement for trading into some areas.
- NOTE 8: Approved Vaccinate:** A sheep that is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:
– vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, or
– vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
• was in the SheepMAP, or
• had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
• had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.
- NOTE 9: Other:** This could include sheep sourced from historical Low Prevalence Areas (LPA), or sheep that previously had an ABC score higher than 4, or were from an area with a regional biosecurity plan.
- NOTE 10: Additional information:** A producer may wish to add additional information pertaining to the consignment and/or consignment flock that is not covered by answering the listed questions. Examples may include historical tests or prevalence areas for OJD, history of OJD vaccination if not continuous, worm resistance test results, where introduced sheep were sourced from, blood lines, micron, breed society, etc.
- NOTE 11: Declaration:** Signing this declaration has legal significance. Regulatory authorities may take legal action, and purchasers may seek damages for any information that is incorrect. Before signing you must be satisfied you understand all elements of the document, and these explanatory notes.

RULES GOVERNING THE EXHIBITION OF HORSE AND PONIES AT THE CAMPERDOWN SHOW

1. No prize money or trophies will be presented until after 2pm.
2. Breed Sections – All horses and ponies must be registered with their respective Breed Society. Owners must be financial members. Classes will be run under their respective society rules.
3. Unless stated otherwise stallions and colts are only permitted to compete in Ring 4 & 5.
4. All Stallions and Colts must be under the control of an adult using a bit.
5. These rules are to be read in conjunction with current EA Show Horse rules (as amended). Copies are available from EA.
6. If any exhibitor fails to produce the correct documentation then all prizes & performances will be withheld for a period of two weeks. Current and correct documentation is to be presented in this time or all prizes and performances will be forfeited.
7. No refunds will be given on any entries, without a medical certificate.
8. Pre-entries are via Nominate only! On the day entries are available at a higher cost.
9. **Entries close the 8th October via NOMINATE**
10. Prize money not collected by 5pm on show day will become the property of the Camperdown P & A Society Inc.
11. **NOVICE** is not to have won a first prize in an open class at any Agricultural Show prior to entry.
12. **INTERMEDIATE** is not to have placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at any 'Royal' Show in a similar class.
13. **NEWCOMERS** not to have competed on/or before the end of May 2024 other than Leading Rein.

SUNDAY GATE ENTRY \$20 PER EXHIBITOR

14. All horses & ponies placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any ridden class in any Ring may be required to produce a current height certificate issued by either EA or R.A.S. Limited measuring facilities will be available.

15. Should a dispute arise over the height of an entrant, the organisers reserve the right to measure the exhibit in dispute.

16. Random swabbing by the Camperdown P & A Society Inc in conjunction with EA may take place.

17. Where a rider's age is specified it relates to the riders age on the day of the Show.

18. All breeding dates are as of the 1st of August in each year for horses and ponies.

19. The Society reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.

20. Telephone entries will not be accepted.

21. The Committee reserves the right to refuse cancel or reject any entry without explanation.

22. Show Hunter Classes – Show Hunter Hack, Galloway and Ponies have more substance than the modern riding pony but still maintain quality. They are expected to move freely at all paces. They may at any time be expected to gallop for the Judge. They are not expected to jump. The turnout for Show Hunter Hacks, Galloways & ponies is more subdued than that of Show Pony, Galloway or Hack classes. No ribbon brow bands or hair bows.

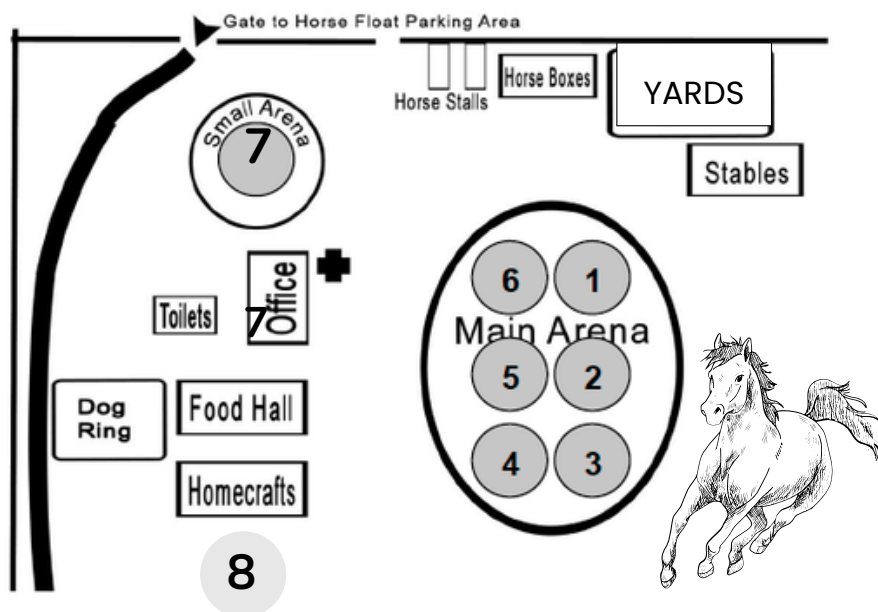

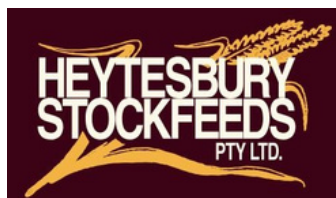

2. Racing name to be used where appropriate. When entering if name is different to racing name, please provide the following details (if known). (Note horse details can be checked on Racing Australia Website): Racing name, Microchip number, Life Number, Registration Certificate Number, Dam and Sire, Date horse retired
3. Riders to be 12 years and over on day of qualifying show.
4. Colts/stallions are not permitted to contest a series qualifier.
5. Qualifying shows must be affiliated with VAS Ltd
6. Once a qualifier has won, the horse cannot compete at another show qualifier in that calendar year.
7. All qualifying winners gain automatic entry in the Off the Track Series Finals to be held at the VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships.

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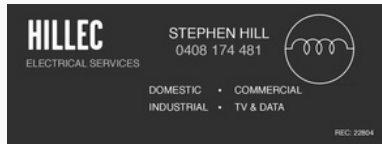
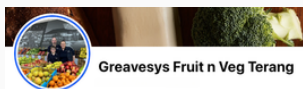
